DEPARTMENT GOAL STATEMENT: The goals of an integrated language arts program are to prepare all students to function as fulfilled individuals, informed and participating citizens in society. Language allows us to communicate effectively with others in our world and requires the integration of listening, speaking, reading, and writing.	

PRIMARY ESLR: Effective communicators will think, listen, and respond through written and oral direction; dramatic/musical presentations, speeches, visual imagery and written responses.

<u>COURSE DESCRIPTION</u>	The student will explore word analysis, vocabulary, read, and respond to historically and culturally significant works, and respond to grade level materials.
<u>TEACHER STATEMENT:</u>	My goal for this class is development of reading and writing skills necessary to form a base for high school English classes. Short essay writing will be emphasized in preparation for the writing proficiency test.
<u>GOALS OF THE COURSE</u>	The goals of ESL I are to produce students who can communicate their own ideas and respond to the ideas of others through writing and speaking.
<u>READING/WRITING COMPONENTS</u>	Reading and writing will be stressed continually. Formal writing for communicating ideas and feelings, persuading and influencing others, and responding to literature and life experiences will be assigned. Listening skills will be enhanced by oral readings by the teacher and other students.

<u>CLASS RULES</u>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <i>BE PREPARED</i> - Be on time, bring your binder, writing implements, and assignments that are due 2. <i>ASK QUESTIONS WHEN YOU DO NOT UNDERSTAND.</i> 3. <i>DO NOT HAVE ANYTHING OR DO ANYTHING THAT DISRUPTS LEARNING</i> - gum, food, hats, hoods, CD players, IPODS, MP3's, cell phones, personal grooming or anything else that disrupts learning are not permitted. 4. <i>RESPECT</i> - Respect the opinions and thoughts of others, even when you disagree. <u>CLASS ATTENDANCE</u>	Regular attendance and participation are essential. Students who have been absent should check the class calendar for missed work. Assignments should be made up promptly. More than eight absences or tardies will result in being dropped from the class with a failing grade (see VHS Attendance and Tardy Policies). Students will be assigned a detention for each third tardy to class.
<u>CLASS HOMEWORK POLICY</u>	Homework is due whether you are absent or not. It is your responsibility to find out what assignment(s) you have missed. If you are absent the day of a test, you will take the test within two (2) days of your return to class. Homework is assigned three of four times weekly and should be completed by the beginning of the class period.
